WOMEN LIVING WITH HIV ARE MORE LIKELY TO REPORT NON-PRESCRIPTION CANNABIS USE AND USE OF ILLICIT DRUGS SUCH AS CRACK, COCAINE, AND HEROIN COMPARED TO THE GENERAL POPULATION OF WOMEN IN BRITISH COLUMBIA (ONTARIO AND QUEBEC POPULATION DATA NOT AVAILABLE)
