COMMUNITY-BASED RESEARCH PHILOSOPHY:

RESEARCH IN WHICH THE COMMUNITY BEING STUDIED IS ACTIVELY INVOLVED, AND BENEFITS DIRECTLY FROM RESEARCH FINDINGS.

ALL CHIWOS DATA WERE COLLECTED BY PEER RESEARCH ASSOCIATES (PRAS); WOMEN LIVING WITH HIV, HIRED AND TRAINED IN RESEARCH CONDUCTION. PRAS CONTRIBUTED TO THE CREATION OF THE SURVEY THROUGHOUT ITS DEVELOPMENT.
